According to a survey conducted by the Audit Bureau of Circulations and the Newspaper Association of America, seven out of ten teenagers ages 12 to 17 reported they read a newspaper at least once a week, and 47 percent said the newspaper was their main source of news and information. In Pakistan there is no such credible data available. "Not a lot of journalists are sending our message from Palestine to the world, so I thought, 'Why not send my message... and show them what is happening in my village."

Journalism

Offering Vast Opportunities to Children



Children born in 1999-2000 are now turning into 18. Children born in 2006 are now 11 years old and children born in 2010 are at the 7th year of their age.

These are the most dynamic and technologically advanced years, so the children born in this time of current history are very advanced and different from the perception of elders who born in 60's, 70's and 80's.



Journalism is the activity of organized thinking for gathering, creating, and presenting information. There are different kinds of journalists but we are focusing on junior and young journalists.7-12 years children are categorized as junior journalists and children aged 13-18 years are named young journalists.



Today children can excel in their young age, achieve tremendously and prosper. The media or mind industry has opened vast opportunities to be materialized in far lesser time than past.





About The Newspaper

According to a recent study conducted by us it was found that most of the students of local schools were familiar with the informational and educational value of newspapers. But they did not know about any newspaper for children.



Printing Process

Hand written or computer typed content is checked by the editor for spelling, grammar and correction of the sentences. Then this final draft is sent to the page maker who is expert in graphically designing the layout with captions, pictures and line work.

The complete designs of pages are then sent to the process room where an impression of computer made layout design is taken on alluminium plates. These alluminium plates are fitted on to plate cylinders of a printing press machine. The press machine has a paper feeding tray and ink rollers.

The ink is used in 4 basic colors, Black, Yellow, Magenta, and Cyan. There are different plates for each color, when all four colors plates pass through the roller it makes colorful printing. The press machine also folds the newspaper. There are different sizes of newspaper, generally it is printed in 23 x 30 inches.



What is Newspaper

A newspaper is a periodical publication containing news regarding current events, informative articles, stories, editorials, and ads. It is usually printed on low-grade paper such as newsprint.

A journalist is a person who works in journalism to report the news and he learns skills of writing which is basic raw material needed for any mass media product.

Must Read

When we apply the formula of 5 W and 1 H (why, what, where, when, who & how) the information becomes news .In journalism your mind is equivalent to the capital where you observe, think and write and it becomes your intellectual asset.

A reporter is a type of journalist who researches, writes, and reports information. Newspaper reporters write news articles and stories for newspapers. They write these articles and stories by interviewing people, asking questions, and doing fact finding surveys.

A columnist is someone who writes their opinions and point of view for a newspaper or magazine.

A correspondent is a journalist who reports from a distant location. They report for a newspaper, or radio or television station, whose staff is based in another location. A foreign correspondent is a correspondent who reports news from another country.

A copy editor checks for errors in spelling and grammar.

A photojournalist is a journalist who takes photographs in order to tell a news story.

Current Affair

Current affairs are the events of

interest happening at the present time. They are generally discussed at home, school, with friends and are also found on TV and newspapers.

Health

Health news are referred to health issues of an individual or a community. To work on health beat a visit to any hospital can be very helpful for situation study. You can interview a doctor about seasonal diseases, their prevention and home remedies. You can research how to be healthy and physically fit or collect data of height and weight of children around and make news.

Sports & Entertainment

You can report any sports event that took place at your school or club
You can write a review of any documentary or movie you watched

You can write about any new game launched or invented.

Review (re + view): Write in your own words

You can review the latest movie or a new video game or maybe you've been to a great exhibition lately, or an inspiring event. Write what you have seen or noticed there which you would like to tell others. Read a book of your interest and write about it.

Science & Technology;

You can write about new researches and discoveries in science & technology.

Survey

Survey means look closely at or examine the situation or a subject and compile them into a report; for example

Picture Story

You can take a photograph which gives some message or tells a story.
